

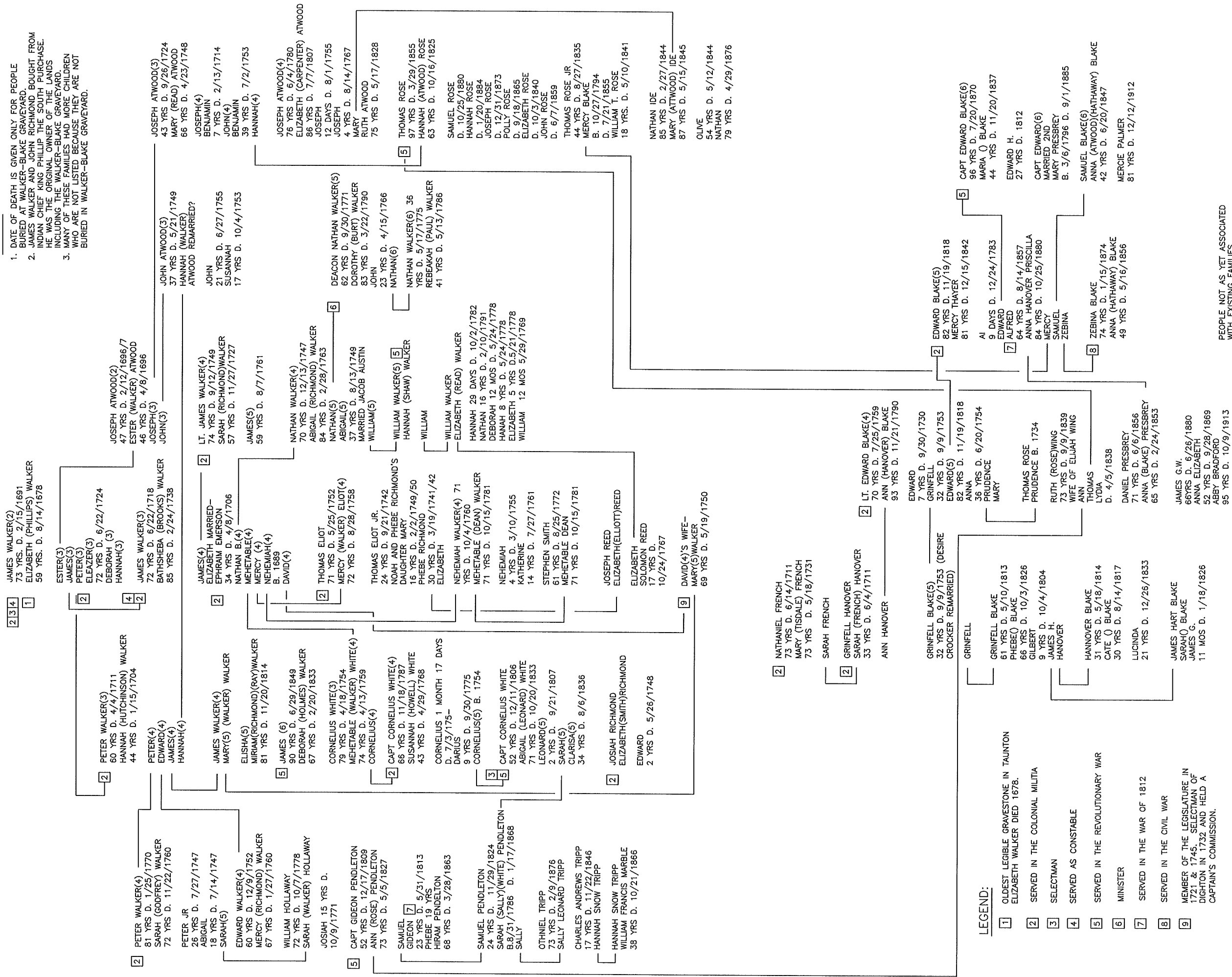

WALKER-BLAKE GRAVEYARD

"being about one acre, to lye forever for a burying place,"
Edward Walker April 23, 1750

NOTES:

1. DATE OF DEATH IS GIVEN ONLY FOR PEOPLE BURIED AT WALKER-BLAKE GRAVEYARD.
2. JAMES WALKER AND JOHN RICHMOND BOUGHT FROM INDIAN CHIEF KING PHILIP THE SOUTH PURCHASE. HE WAS THE ORIGINAL OWNER OF THE LANDS INCLUDING THE WALKER-BLAKE GRAVEYARD.
3. MANY OF THESE FAMILIES HAD MORE CHILDREN WHO ARE NOT LISTED BECAUSE THEY ARE NOT BURIED IN WALKER-BLAKE GRAVEYARD.
